Plug-in electric vehicles are a cleaner alternative to traditional vehicles, and with generous purchasing subsidies and lower fuel and operating costs, they can also be a cheaper alternative, too. The federal government, for example, offers a tax credit of up to \$7,500 for an electric vehicle purchase. Pepco offers EV charger rebates and other incentives. And, fuel costs for EVs are about half that of traditional fuels, according to the the Depart of Energy's eGallon tool. Transportation Electrification Roadmap
