

## Electric vehicle safety luxembourg city

Chargy is Luxembourg's network of publicly accessible charging stations for electric vehicles and plug-in hybrids. It has been operational since June 2017. For 2019, the managing authority plans to install 200 new charging stations across the country. The network is expected to reach 800 charging stations by the end of 2021: 400 in public municipal car parks and 400 in park-and-ride car parks, which provide easy access to public transport.

102 of the country's 800 charging stations will be located in the capital. By 2013, the City of Luxembourg had already launched a project to install electric charging stations in three public car parks (Schuman, Rode and P+R Bouillon). This was extended in 2016 with the installation of three electric charging stations in the car park of the Luxembourg City Conservatoire.

The charging stations will be located on public thoroughfares and in car parks in such a way as to create a dense network, guaranteeing maximum, city-wide coverage.

Full details about the Chargy network - list of charging service providers, incorporation of third-party stations into the system, list of compatible stations, etc. - can be found on the Chargy web site ([chargy.lu/en/](http://chargy.lu/en/)).

Payment can be made at all charging stations belonging to the network using a standard issue Chargy mKart smartcard, which also functions as a Verkeersverbondtransport pass. Users must subscribe with a charging service provider in order to access the stations using their Chargy mKart card. Once they have subscribed, they will be able to view their electricity charges and locate charging stations.

The automotive sector has seen its electromobility sales take off in recent years, with an increasing number of electric and hybrid vehicle registrations. Luxembourg is supporting this environmentally friendly initiative by providing an extensive network of public charging stations, which are now available on the motorways.

The network of public charging points for electric cars and plug-in hybrids was launched in the Grand Duchy in 2017, it was given the name Chargy. In 2022, more than 700 charging stations are available to users across the country on public car parks in the municipalities and on the P+R network, offering easy access to public

transport. The objective is to reach a total of 1,600 charging points dedicated to electric mobility.

Each station has two charging points that can be adjusted between 3.7kW and 22kW depending on the type of vehicle. All network charging points have a standard payment method: the multi-functional Chargy mKaart smart card. Users must subscribe with a charging service provider in order to access the stations using their Chargy card. The service also offers several other options: users can view their electricity charges, locate charging stations and reserve a charging point.
